RODNEY BAY MARINA

Our St. Lucia base in Rodney Bay is the starting point for a bareboat yacht charter exploring the Windward Islands, the ideal gateway for exploring nearby Martinique and Guadeloupe to the north and St. Vincent and the Grenadines, Tobago Cays and Mustique to the south.

RODNEY BAY MARINA FACILITIES

- Fresh water and Electricity on docks
- Toilet and showers facilities in two areas. Access is gained by using the code issued by reception on your arrival.
- Restaurants and Bars - a choice ranging from local cuisine, pizzeria, Thai, Sushi, Indian or continental, and large variety of bars, all open from 7:00 - midnight(bars)
- 1st National St Lucia Bank - open on Saturday mornings
- Accommodation
- Wireless Internet access throughout the marina.
- Swimming pool and Bar
- Shops - selection of onsite retail outlets, duty-free chandlery, 10 min away Rodney Bay and Bay Walk shopping malls with approximately 50 retail outlets supermarkets, boutiques, banks, hairdressers, hardware, electronics, many restaurants and bars

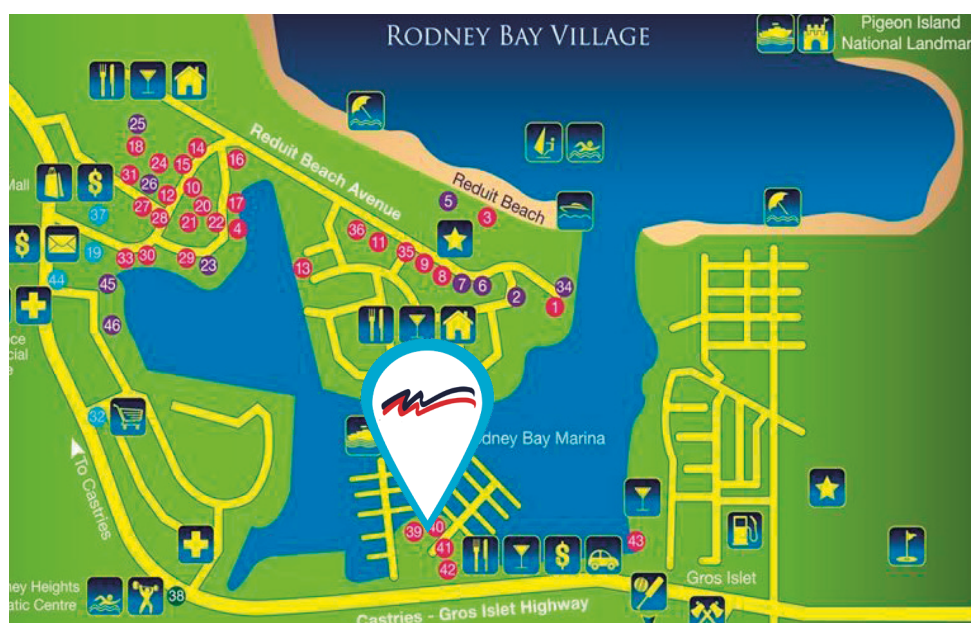

ARRIVAL PROCEDURE

It is necessary that all our guests announce their arrival in time, so The Moorings can organise a pick up from the airport. If you arrive late to the airport, the taxi driver will take you directly to your yacht. If you need to contact the base after hours, please contact Lene Volney, the base manager.

- Provisioning is brought to the yacht in advance.
- Restaurants can deliver food to the yacht while the quarantine is lasting.
- Check - In is done onboard
- Area briefings are available online: for [Grenada](#) region and for [Martinique](#) region
- Boat briefings are done with only Skipper and First Mate present, while wearing face masks

TRANSFER

Please contact the base to organise transfers. From George Charles (Vigie) Airport it takes about 15 minutes. It costs approximately USD 25 for the first three people, and USD 10 for each extra passenger each way. From Hewanorra International Airport it takes about an hour and a half. It costs approximately USD 90 for the first three people, and USD 25 per person for each extra passenger each way.

TIME DIFFERENCE

Rodney Bay Marina is AST (Atlantic Standard Time), so -4 hours UTC/GMT

UPON ARRIVAL

CHECK IN PROCEDURE

Your yacht will be ready at 12:00 for boarding. Please head to the reception first upon arrival for a check-in and further information. There is also a possibility for **evening boarding** at 18.00 the day before, so ask your booking agent for more information. Please come to our Reception with these things ready:

- Face masks
- Passports for every crew member
- Valid skippers licence
- Credit card for the Deposit



BOAT BAG

At the chart briefing, each captain is given a boat bag, which contains the boat documents, the crew list and the last customs clearance form, as well as the skippers notices information, and a telephone to use while here.

CHART AND YACHT BRIEFINGS

Chart briefings are sent to you pre-departure via email, so please look out for this online briefing. The base will do a briefing to go over specific points, however it is important that you watch the chart briefing online before you arrive in St Lucia.

Both Area and Boat briefings are mandatory for all skippers, Enjoy more time on the water by watching the required [Safety](#) and Chart briefing videos for St. Lucia region to [Grenada](#) and to [Martinique](#) online before your arrival in the comfort of your home or office. After viewing it, you are welcome to send any questions via email to our local Chart Briefer or Sales Agent. Onboard each vessel is also a hard copy of Sailors guide that can also be viewed online [HERE](#).

The yacht briefing introduces you to your yacht, its systems and rigging. It is carried out individually

for each yacht once you board and are ready. It is important that all systems and equipment are fully understood.

Only Skipper and First Mate can participate in the consultations, while wearing a face mask. The times of briefings are negotiable with clients upon arrival.

WHAT TO DO WHILE WAITING FOR YOUR BOAT

- Watch the online Area briefing
- Relax by the pool next to the Moorings office

- Enjoy one of 5 nearby marina restaurants and bars

- Arts and Craft shopping in the marina
- Duty free shopping



SKIPPERED CHARTER

The skipper's time is booked from 12:00 to 11:00 in 23-hour periods. If you have reserved him for the first day of your charter and have a 6:00pm start, he will use this time to ensure he is happy with all aspects of the yacht and will be at the base to meet you upon your arrival. If you have reserved him for a later date on your charter he will start at 12:00pm on that day. He is responsible for the safety of your yacht so he is never to leave it unattended.

For "check out charters" (anything less than the full duration of the charter) the check out skipper's time is booked from 18:00 to 18:00 to allow for a meet and greet in the evening and go over basic systems, then a full day with you the next day. This skipper is required to give you a thorough briefing on all aspects of the yacht and dinghy in addition to assisting you with planning an itinerary for the trip and advising you how to contact the base, the return to base procedures and the emergency assistance procedures. It is your responsibility to get the skipper back to base in case of one-day charters and to take care of the skipper's food and beverage.

Due to **new COVID 19 regulations**, the skipper must also have his or her own cabin. If you expect your skipper to stay in the bow, please let us know well in advance so that we can choose the appropriate (small) skipper. The skipper will also wear a face mask at all times when maintaining an appropriate social distance isn't possible, like indoors. We kindly ask you to do the same.

There are several different countries represented within the cruising grounds of the Windward Islands and each of them require customs/immigration clearance upon arrival and departure. Fees vary based on the country, yacht, number of passengers, itinerary etc. All charters with a skipper are encouraged to provide the skipper with an initial \$500 at the beginning their charter. This money will be used to cover costs for customs fees as well as mooring ball fees for the duration of the charter. The total amount needed may be less or it may be more - the skipper will return any remaining funds along with receipts for all the money spent.

The tip for the skipper is at a client's discretion, usually between 10 - 20% of the charter price.

SAILING LICENCE

Although no sailing licenses are required for cruising in St Lucia, you will need to fill out our [sailing resume](#) to see if you have the experience to charter a yacht with The Moorings. If you have a sailing certificate, we strongly recommend that you take this on vacation with you too.

BOAT PAPERS

Boats papers must always be up to date, especially for clients visiting French countries. Boats that are French registered and did not pay the VAT are not permitted entry. Clients must specify at the booking stages if they wish to visit a French country so they can be given the appropriate boat for that purpose.



PROVISIONING

If you have preordered provisioning for your boat, please check your order is complete. You can order on store.moorings.com, just please note that it should be done at least a week prior to your embarkation. Also, make sure you select the correct The Moorings base while ordering. If you are looking to provision locally, we recommend Massy Store, which is approx. 5 minute walk from the base. Opening times are:

Mon-Fri: 7am- 9pm

Sat: 7am – 7pm

Sun: 7am – 4pm.

COOL BOXES

Coolers are available at the base on a first come first serve basis at no additional charge. Only one per boat.

WIFI

At the moment there is WiFi available only on some of the Moorings yachts, but one can connect to various hotspots along the region.

ELECTRICITY

The standard voltage on all yachts is 12 volts. Electricity in St. Lucia is 110 volts AC, 50Hz and uses the standard US 2-pin plug, so if you're using different ones, make sure you bring an adapter. Not all boats have generators, so it's good to bring a 12 V cord as well.

BARBEQUE

All yachts are equipped with a barbeque, so feel free to order some briquettes and fire starters from provisioning service. While in use, please move your dinghy to the bow and have a bucket of water handy.

MUSIC

All boats are fitted with a radio and CD player. If you wish to listen to your music while sailing, please bring your own cords.

SECURITY

Please be careful about your own and The Moorings possessions, so lock your boat while ashore - like you do at home. Always carry your wallet, cash, papers etc. with you while ashore, and use the 3 padlocks provided: one for locking the outboard to the dinghy, one for locking dinghy to the dock while ashore and one to lock dinghy to the boat at night.



CURRENCY EXCHANGE, CREDIT CARDS AND BANKS

The local currency in St. Lucia is the Eastern Caribbean Dollar. US dollars are also used throughout the Windwards, however we highly recommend to use the EC while on charter. For a 7-10 (14) day charter it will be good to have at least 1250ECD to cover the cost of Custom, Water, Ice, Mooring Buoys, Pack Fees, Boat Boys etc. This will make your charter journey easier and cheaper.

Credit cards, Visa and MasterCard are also accepted in most places. You can exchange your currency at the base.

A 1st National Bank is located in the Marina Village and is open Mon-Fri from 8am-4pm and on Saturdays from 8am-12pm and is closed on Sunday. There's also a 24-hour ATM machine beside the bank. There are other banks in Rodney Bay with similar opening hours, although they are closed on Saturdays and Sundays.

REFUELING

We would highly recommend that all clients pre-pay fuel. The Moorings clients who did not do that will be taken to the fuel station at the end of the charter by one of our dock staff. One full tank suffices for any holiday, however if you really need to fuel up, ask the base for advice, as we like to keep contaminated fuel away from our tanks.

WATER AND GARBAGE

Water can be purchased at most of the islands you will be sailing to. We will cover this topic on the chart briefing, or you can find more information in the destinations section of this guide. Never give your garbage to boat boys, you should dispose of it directly in garbage points along the coast or simply at the base end of their charter.

YOUR SAFETY

Please locate your safety card when you get onboard & ensure that all crew read it before leaving the marina. If you cannot find it, then please contact customer service team who can provide a replacement. Although you will have watched the online safety briefing before leaving home, we recommend that you all re-watch the video before leaving the dock. This can be done on your own devices using the QR code.

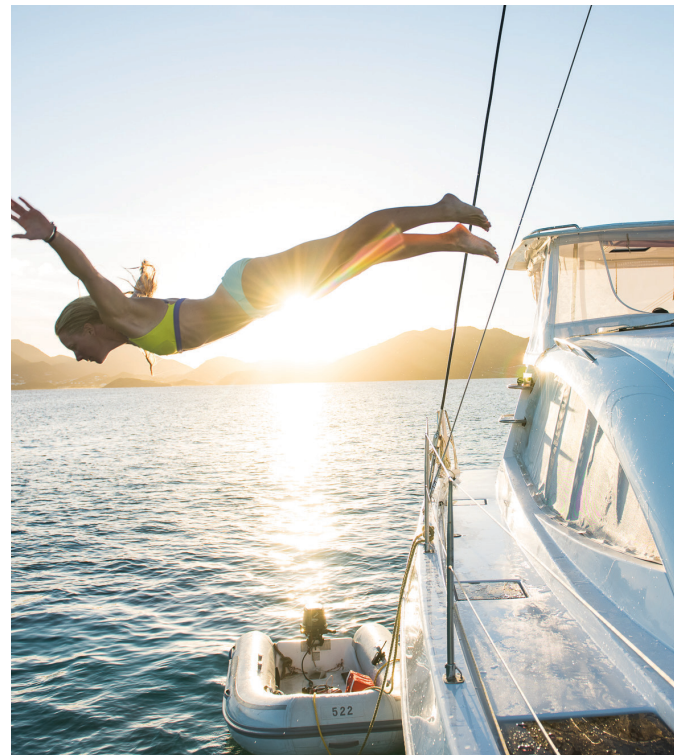


YACHT DAMAGE WAIVER AND SECURITY DEPOSIT

Forgot to get YDW before you departed? We've got you covered! Inquire at the reception for further details.

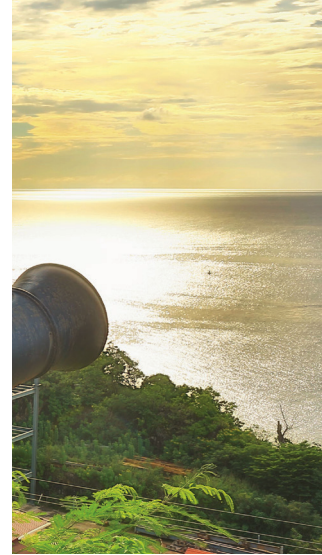
Please be aware that in case of damage to the boat or loss of equipment onboard, The Moorings maintains the right to keep a correspondent amount of the security deposit.

If damage to the boat is done through gross negligence and above the value of the given security deposit, the guest may be liable to pay the full cost of the damage.



BEFORE LEAVING THE BASE

- Ensure you have all the kitchen equipment and bedding you require, extra bedding and some cooking utensils are available upon request.
- Equip your crew with snorkeling fins from a box on the dock. Take note that we are no longer providing snorkelling masks or snorkels.
- Make sure the fuel/water tanks are full.
- Make sure you have your boat bag with all contents.
- Make sure you are provisioned.
- Make sure you have enough cash.
- Check your safety equipment. We have a limited supply of children's life jackets (age 4+ only). If you have your own children's life jacket we would encourage you to bring it along.



WHILE SAILING

MAINTAIN A LOOKOUT

All The Moorings yachts are equipped with an autopilot. Make sure one person is always maintaining a lookout, especially if the auto pilot is on . This person should be close to the helm and should watch for other vessel, debris, fish pots, land or other navigational hazards.

Make sure your lookout knows how to disengage the autopilot and brief him / her on what to watch out for. Breaking water or patches of light colored water and brown areas may indicate shallow water or rocks. Seeing one fish pot usually means that there will be others.

We want to make sure your sailing vacation is fun, memorable and successful. So if you have any problems during your yacht charter, please call us and we'll sort them out within 4 working hours from your call. Check out more details [online](#).

WHEN YOU RETURN TO PORT LOUIS MARINA


RETURN TO BASE PROCEDURE

- Please empty all holding tanks and bilges before returning to base.
- Use VHF channel 16, or better even - the provided cellphone to call the Moorings base about 15 min before arriving in order to get instructions.
- Make sure to prepare your fenders.
- One of our Staff will come on board and take you to the fuel dock first, and then to your designated berth.

BEFORE YOU LEAVE YOUR BOAT

Please ensure:

- To leave 15-20 minutes for a debrief. A member of the Moorings Customer Service will come to your boat to conduct a debrief process to record any maintenance issue that needs repairing before the next charter on the vessel. Please make sure **only the Captain** is onboard for this while wearing a mask.
- The boat bag with the cellphone and documents with the last customs clearance form needs to be left on the chart table.
- Charts, keys and guide book have been left in the chart table.
- All rubbish has been removed and disposed of in marina bins or left on the dock for collecting.
- All cupboards and refrigerator have been emptied of food.
- Sheets and towels are left on the beds. They will be fogged for disinfection after your disembarkation.
- All personal possessions have been removed; please check thoroughly as items are often left onboard.
- All hatches are closed.



Please remember your boat needs to be vacated by 11:00. You will be taken directly from your yacht to the airport.

USEFUL INFORMATION



NON-SAILING ACTIVITIES

Restaurants & Tipping

St Lucia region offers tourists plenty of seafood, West Indian dishes and French and Italian food. Favourite local dishes include fish stew, curried lambi (conch) and the ubiquitous roti. Pigeon peas with rice, plantains, yams and callaloo soup are common side dishes. Lobster season is from September – May, so you can enjoy fresh lobster on your trip if you go during this time.

Carib beer and Westerhall rum are the local brews; it's also worth trying local nonalcoholic drinks, such as sorrel juice, mauby and ginger beer.

If you are looking to travel in low season we would advise that you will have a limited choice of restaurants to eat ashore and to provision accordingly. This would be a perfect time of year to enjoy a barbecue off the back of you boat.

There is an eight percent government tax at hotels and restaurants. Most also add a 10 percent service charge. Additional gratuities are at your discretion.

BE AWARE

Manchineel Trees are among the most dangerous in the world, also known as “the little apple of death, mainly found in Mayreau. Do not touch it or stand under it if it rains, the fruit is toxic.

Also, watch out for mosquitoes and sandflies, and don't forget sun screen!



Shopping

Lots of variety including wood carvings and paintings, ranging from naive to sophisticated, jewelery, from natural materials to emeralds and gold. Batiks in the fabulous colors of the Caribbean and of course spices, jams, jellies and rum.

Fishing

You do not need to have a fishing license and you can either rent fishing gear from the base, or you can bring their own gear. Seasonal catches include mackerel, king mackerel, white marlin, barracuda, kingfish and sailfish, while spear fishing isn't allowed. It is safe to eat any fish you catch.

Diving and Snorkeling

Saint Lucia's underwater seascapes are similar to and just as gorgeous as those found above the water on this tropical island. Divers enjoy pinnacles covered with sponges, corals and gorgonians that make these underwater formations as colorful as a rainbow. Sheer walls, shipwrecks and coral reefs also offer divers interesting environments to explore. Also, remember that diving in St Lucia isn't allowed without a guide.

For snorkeling, we will supply the fins, however we cannot supply the masks and snorkels at this time. You can either bring your own or purchase the items at the Chandlery store.

Make sure to always hoist the diver down flag!

Hiking

From St Lucia to Grenada, including a number of other islands in the sailing region offer superb hiking – a great way to experience stunning rainforests, tucked away villages, magnificent views out to sea and the chance to cool off under spectacular waterfalls.

Swim Safe

Swimming is often a fun and important part of a vacation. However local rules, flag systems, currents and where swimming may be permitted, can be different and vary from country to country. We strongly recommend that you and all your crew read through our '[swim safe](#)' [information](#) before you travel. Unfortunately even the strongest of swimmers can get into difficulties. The information on our website covers children, your surroundings, looking out for others, and not overestimating your own ability. Snorkel vests, Life Jackets and Diver Down flags are all available on board.





EVENTS

There is always a party going on somewhere in Saint Lucia, ranging from weekly street Jump-ups and Fish Fries to cultural celebrations such as Fisherman's Feast, Carnival, Jounen Kweyol and our internationally-staged Saint Lucia Jazz & Arts Festival. Other competitive events include the long-standing sailing event – the Atlantic Rally for Cruisers and Tri Saint Lucia.



St Lucia Jazz & Arts Festival (early May)

A long-standing jazz festival with live music performances, street parties and fashion shows held in over 15 stunning St Lucian venues. Music genres include jazz, calypso, soca and R&B, with artists coming from across the Caribbean and beyond.

A lively and colourful event which includes dancing, street parades, story telling and much partying throughout the island, although the major events take place in Castries.



Chocolate Heritage Month (August)

A celebration of the thriving cocoa industry, where visitors to the island can take part in cocoa plantation tours, sample chocolate-inspired dishes and indulge in spa treatments that make use of the product.



Jounen Kwayol (October)

Known as Creole Day, this festival celebrates the island's rich Creole heritage and features cultural demonstrations and musical performances. Towns across the island host events, giving visitors the opportunity to learn more about the diverse influences and to sample Creole dishes.

CRUISING AREA

PREVAILING WINDS

Forming the eastern border of the Caribbean Sea, the Windward Islands' N-S orientation means the winds will be on the beam more often than not when traveling south. This is ideal for fast cruising on the longer passages between some of the islands.

A prime time for a St Lucia yacht charter is during the winter months when a cool NE wind blows across the shores. Heading North, cruising close-hauled or on a close reach is typical while those that opt for a one-way charter can cover more ground and avoid moving windward.

Wind velocities run the gamut from a gentle 10 knots to a more spirited 25 knots, often strengthening off the northern ends of the islands due to land effect.

Temperatures range from 65°F to 85°F (18°C to 29°C) from December till May, and from 75°F to 95°F (24°C to 35°C) from June till November. Navigation is straightforward, though plotting courses and keeping an eye on the GPS is important.

The hurricane season is from June to November, so be prepared for some tropical storms, and check with the base on any approaching weather. Good idea is to keep the base cellphone at person at all times.

WEATHER FORECASTS

The base provides a weather forecast for the next 7 days. Get your copy at reception after your briefing is done. Guests need to consult the Sailors Guide to the Windward Islands for AM/FM stations from Martinique to Trinidad. There are locations at Blue Lagoon St Vincent, Tyrell Bay, Clifton Harbor and Bequia where forecasts are posted daily. Radio reception can be very poor in the islands. Reports can also be obtained by calling the Moorings bases by mobile phone. Additionally you can also check it here:

TIDAL STREAMS

In the Windward Islands the tidal range is very small: 30 cm to 60 cm (1 to 2 feet) including the variation of level due to atmospheric pressure and dominant winds.

SAILING AREA LIMITS

- The area around Soufriere and the Pitons in St. Lucia is a national park with restrictions on anchoring.
- All windward sides of the islands should be kept well clear of.
- The Tobago Cays is restricted from the south side due to the large number of coral heads in the channel which are difficult to see.
- In all bays, anchor with caution to avoid damaging coral or sea grass beds. Blue Lagoon in St. Vincent has a difficult entrance, so it is a good idea to have a local pilot upon your first arrival, or give a call for assistance to the Blue Lagoon Marina on cellphone or VHF 68.

This information is covered more in depth in the chart briefing.

BOAT BOYS

On your sailing trip you will encounter plenty of Boat Boys. They sell you everything you may need and they can bring you to a Mooring Buoy if you need it. Make sure to always negotiate and pay attention if you're paying in ECD or USD. The base will elaborate more on boat boys at the briefing.

MOORING FEES AND TAXES

The Windward Islands are four separate countries and there is no formal cruising tax for the windward regions. However, you must clear customs as you pass through each country and, generally, there are fees associated with the clearing process:

Mooring facilities are provided in some areas for overnight stays. These are managed by local restaurants and bars or marinas. Charges are variable but start at ECD 60 a night for a mooring ball.

A marine park fee for Tobago Cays is EC 45/day per boat + EC 10/day per day, per person. This can't be purchased in advance at our base; it will be done on the marine park facility.

ACCIDENTAL GROUNDING

If you should accidentally run aground the most important thing is to get off again as soon as possible - for those purposes please call the base as soon as possible and we will provide you with immediate assistance.

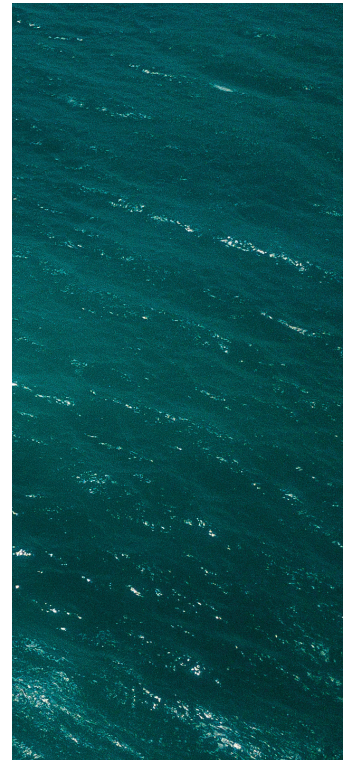
Grounding is not a pleasant experience so try to make sure it does not happen to you.

NIGHT SAILING

Night Sailing is not permitted; you must be moored at least one hour before sunset at all our locations.

It is strictly forbidden to sail alone; we require two persons minimum on board.



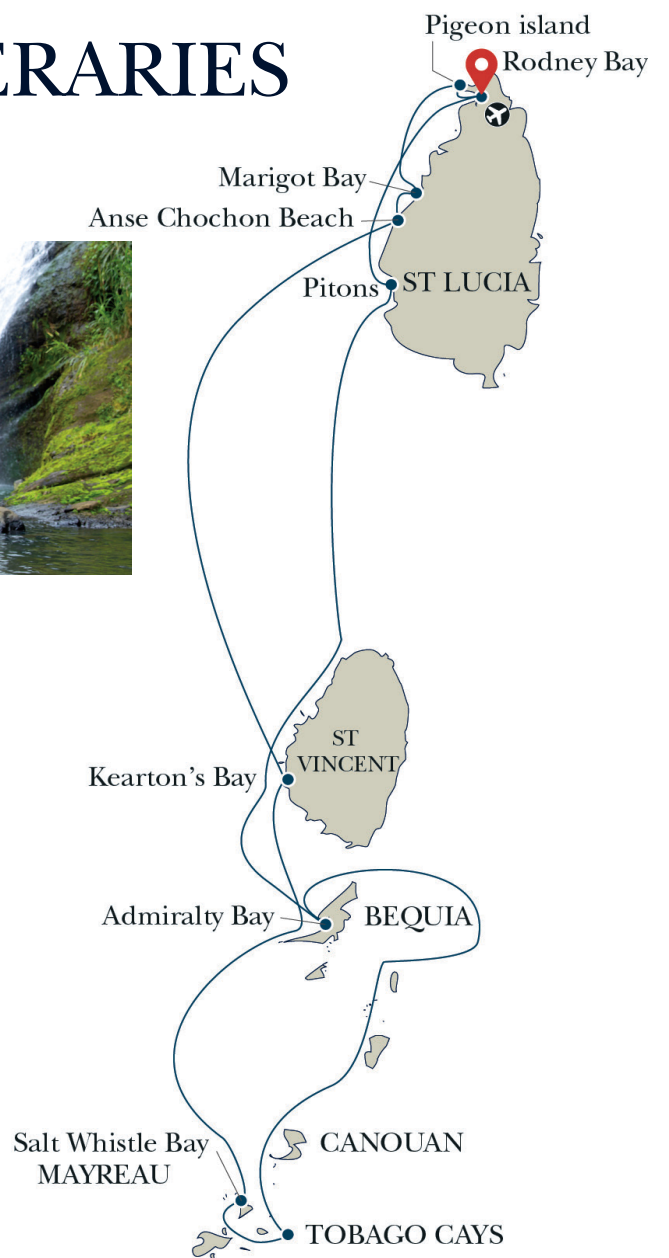

- Never throw anything into the sea, that includes small items like cigarette butts or fruit peel.
- Use holding tanks in marinas and at anchorages. Empty them when at least two miles from the nearest land.
- Be careful while anchoring so as not to damage the sea bed.
- Do not collect any shells from the beach and respect sealife in general.
- Avoid any accidental spills into the sea when refueling.
- Turn off electricity when not needed.
- When using the A/C make sure the yacht doors are closed.
- Minimise plastic.
- Take short showers.
- Buy local.
- Use eco-friendly and fair-trade products.
- Recycle and reuse.
- Save fuel - cruise on a slower speed or sail as much as possible.

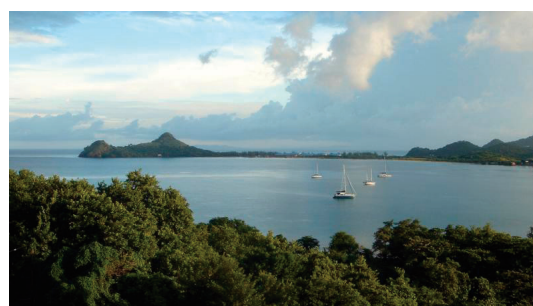
ST LUCIA

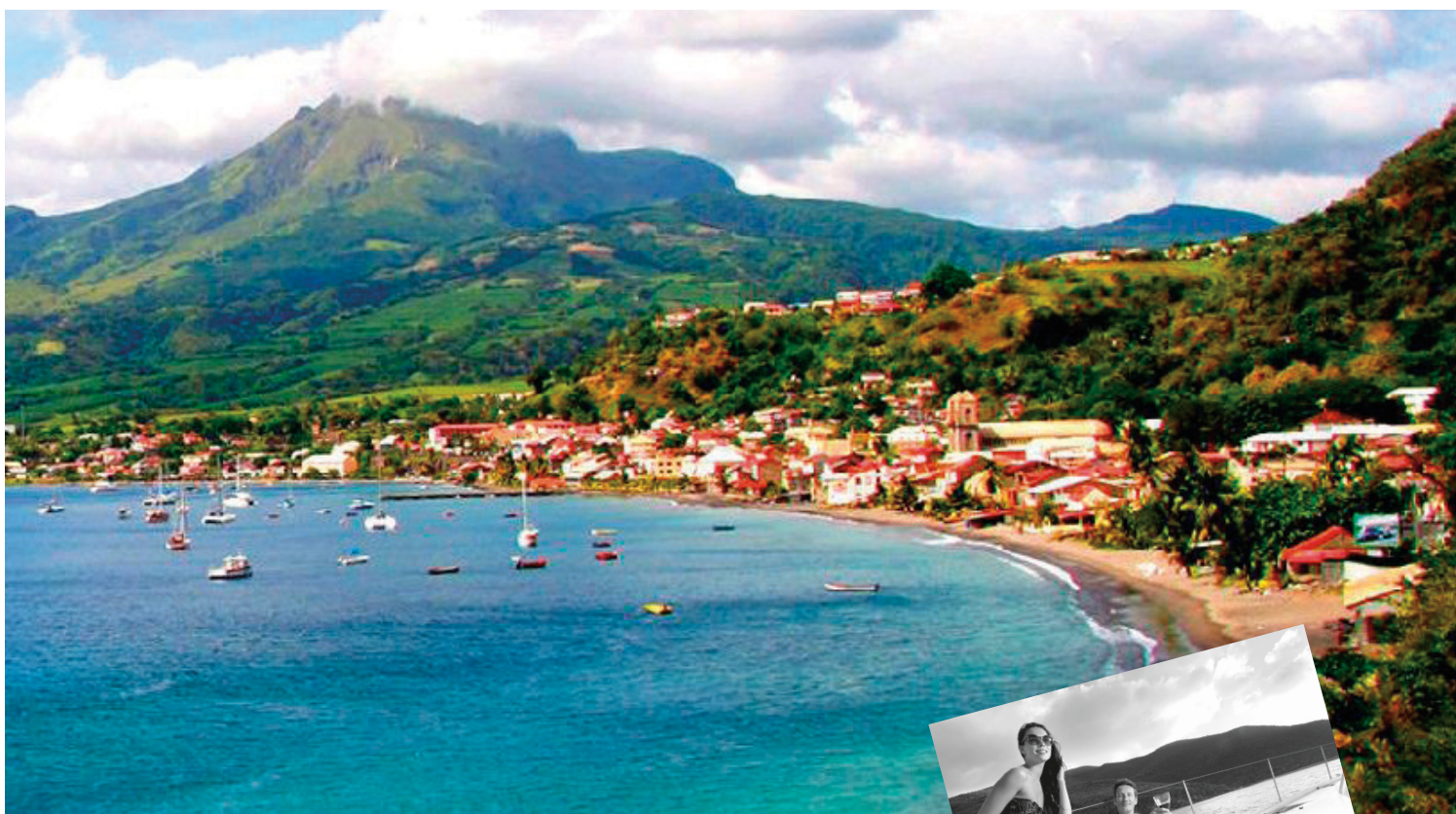
SAINTE ANNE

Venture into town and explore the undisturbed ruins before a walk through the nearby museum. Sink your toes into the black-sand beach, or cruise only a couple of hundred yards off the shore to see more than 10 shipwrecks just below the surface, which are now protected with a no-anchor regulation.

Martinique is world famous not only for its beaches, fine cuisine, and gorgeous panoramas, but also for its fine rum.

RHUM J.M. is located on the north end of the island, at the base of Mt. Pelee. The farming of the sugar cane is processed slightly different here, due to the location being at the bottom of an active volcano. The nutrients from the soil of past eruptions assist with giving a unique flavor to their Rhum. Even though almost every Rhum Agricole distillery on the island of Martinique uses the same techniques perfected by Clement, few get anywhere near the quality of the crop that Rhum JM achieves. The maker and farmer live on the property along with the distillery and acres of cane and banana fields. This allows for the sugar cane to be harvested exactly when its ready, and crushed immediately to get the best quality juice every single time. Definitely worth a visit.
